

We Cared and Shared It Was A Great Year for Community Giving



What an exciting year for our Lodge to once again participate in the Elks National Foundation Community Investment Programs. In the past year the ENF put aside \$19 million for Lodges to invest in their communities with grant monies.

We were fortunate once again to be approved and given \$3500 for the Beacon Grant. The Florida state Elks matched this. We worked with Embrace Families, the region's lead agency for child welfare. Did you take an ornament from the Christmas tree and buy a gift for a child? Thank you. On December 11 our main room was totally full of gifts. There were also gift cards for older teens and food cards for parents. Along with donations from agencies EF works with, 320 children from foster families were provided with gifts chosen by parents. Outside was entertainment , hot dogs and snacks. This grant is renewable so let's plan with them for an activity in 2022-2023.

The \$2000 Spotlight Grant was given to First United Methodist Church of St. Cloud. Each Tuesday and Thursday they offer Bags of Love. Non-perishable items in containers plus a hot meal are available. There also might be clothing, socks, counseling, housing info, etc. During this frigid weather they had cots and food for overnight stays for the homeless. Using their kitchen on Sunday, they alternate with 4 other churches to offer a hot meal from the Elmer's Kitchen program. These grant monies might provide a refrigerator, supplies, clothing, etc. Here's an interesting tidbit about one of their members— he finds and repairs (at his cost) beat up bicycles and donates to those in need.

Finally, the Gratitude Grant was given to Help Now a domestic abuse shelter in Kissimmee. Their goals are to offer safety, empowerment and healing from domestic violence. Offering 52 (38 because of Covid) beds in a 10,000sf facility it is a haven for those in imminent danger from their partners. Children and pets are accepted and a family can stay up to 3 months. Offered are counseling, legal advice, child care, plus other programs to encourage healing and independence. Their \$2000 might go towards a new water heater, beds or all the supplies needed to house a facility that is usually full. This large facility is always in need of some sort of maintenance. Perhaps an Elk work day could be in our future?

I encourage all of you to look at your community. Who needs a boost of funds to continue their good deeds?
